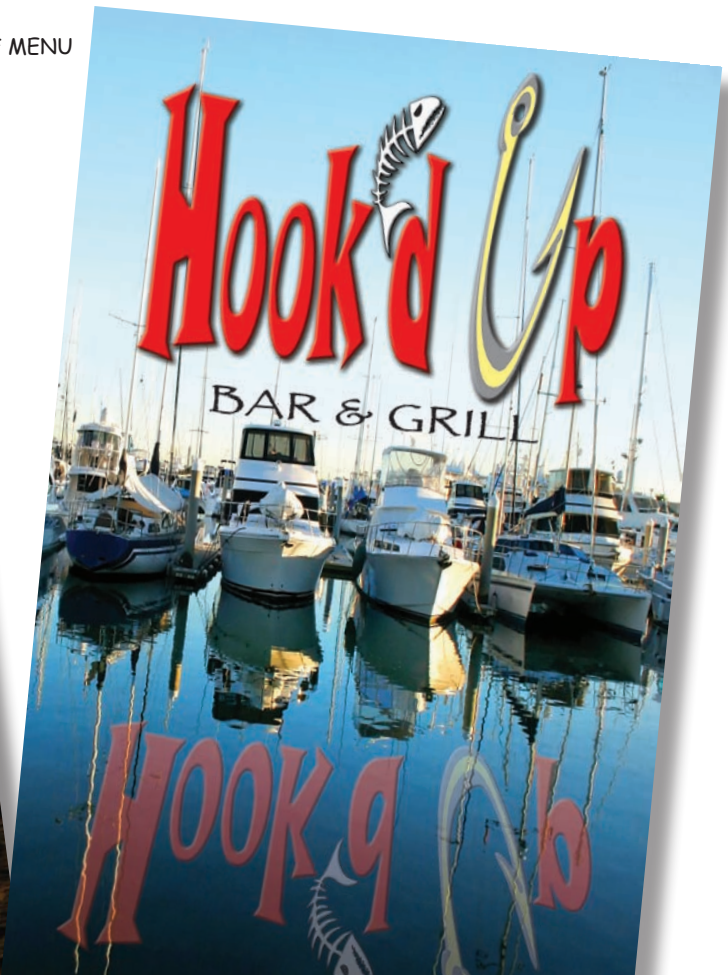

Ghislaine Dadié Finds Success In Empowering Others

When Crude Distillation Process Engineer Ghislaine "G" Dadié envisioned the ProSeed Project, never in his wildest dreams did he think it would go so far.

ProSeed, a Christian non-profit organization, began as a simple vision to promote education and to empower children in his native country of Ivory Coast, West Africa.

After fundraising for a year, Dadié and a team of five American friends and family members traveled to an elementary school in the village of Dizo Gremian, Ivory Coast, West Africa in 2016. They donated 110 benches for the children to sit on while doing their schoolwork, built a 2000 square foot playground and recognized students for academic excellence.

"We built a playground for the kindergarten with slides, swings and merry-go-rounds. Some of the kids had heard about swings and slides from books, but had never seen them before," said Dadié. It was touching to see the kids playing on them. Now, it's a place where there can learn and play at the same time."



The Cattle are Grazing at Convent

Jean-Louis Veillon's family has ranching for his entire life. His father began the commercial cattle operation in Convent 35 years ago and leased grazing land from Motiva for the last 25.

When Jean-Louis took over, it was business as usual until six years ago, when he decided to take the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) advice and practice better soil management.

"We changed the way we looked at running our farm from growing cattle to growing grass," said Veillon. "The cattle are the by-product. The USDA preached it to me daily, and I finally saw the light. The cattle market is very volatile right now, so you have to love it - it's a lifestyle."

Over the last six years, Veillon has introduced many techniques that have made the tough job of cattle ranching a little easier.

"We changed our grazing practices to rotational grazing. We stay off the tractors, and we don't spray chemicals. I actually spray very little because we want to keep the soil healthy," said Veillon.

"We practice 100 percent no till and use a no-till drill, which means we don't plow to plant. We plant certain grasses that grow better in the winter time, and we try to keep green pastures year-round by planting grasses, certain brassicas and legumes."

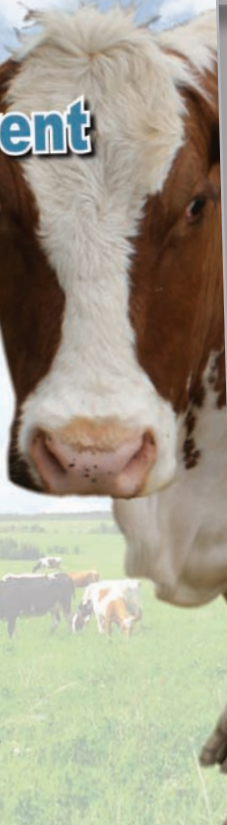
"We let the land support itself. Nature knows what it wants to do - instead of fighting the land, we're working with it. Keeping the grass healthy also helps with the on-going threat of flooding in Louisiana."

"My pastures are like a big sponge and are very healthy. Last year, we flooded five or six times, and on New Year's we were under water. But the water gets out and the grass rebounds. The water permeates through the soil faster so a week later we can get back to grazing."

Veillon said he values his relationship with Motiva.

"We take care of Motiva's land and it's actually a 100 percent better than when we got it. Owning 500 acres of land in this parish is pretty much non-existent unless you inherit it and leasing land from Motiva allows us to do what I do."

It's a hard life, but you do it for the passion of raising the animals and the challenge. I count my blessings to be able to live out my dreams."

Rain, Rain, Drain Away

You can't stop the rain and you can't change the flat, swampy lands of south Louisiana. But, you can improve the drainage.

A three-month project to improve drainage around the Convent Administration Building, turnstiles, and surrounding area was completed at the end of last year. Improvements to culverts, ditches, and underground piping have eliminated the pools of standing water that presented safety hazards, inconvenienced Convent employees and formed a breeding ground for mosquitos.

According to Project Manager Nick Burkhead, the site initiated improvements due to safety concerns.

"Rain brought standing water in the turnstile area, contributing to a high risk of slips and falls. When we made the decision to eliminate the safety hazard, we saw an opportunity to improve drainage in other areas that also posed problems."

Following a civil engineering investigation and a month of construction, rain water is flowing off site.

The project included:

- The cleaning and clearing out of culverts and ditches
- New, and/or wider ditches
- Improved drain grills on both sides of the turnstiles
- Replacement and addition of underground drainage pipes
- Upsized culverts for faster water flow
- A road closure near Tezucuo for the construction of an extra-wide ditch

"All the drainage has been tied together with all water directed away from the site and toward the river," Burkhead said. He mentioned adding that patches of new grass indicate areas where the site added, relocated or replaced drains.

A side benefit of the drainage project is the addition of a sidewalk from Tezucuo Place to the trailers, which extends the site's fitness walking trails.
